

# Ask the Doc: About Carpal Tunnel Syndrome

In this series of articles, Dr. Tracy Russell, D.C., the hand & foot Chiropractor in Bartlesville who has decades of experience, answers common questions relating to chiropractic care. This month's question is:



# How is carpal tunnel syndrome (CTS) managed by a chiropractor?

"Carpal tunnel syndrome is when the median nerve is compressed, which can cause pain, numbness or tingling, and weakness in the thumb, index, middle, and sometimes ring fingers," said Dr. Russell.

The median nerve runs from the neck, through the shoulder, down the arm and through the wrist. Compression of this nerve at any of these locations can result

in CTS-like hand and wrist symptoms. In addition, when a nerve is compressed in more than one location, it becomes hypersensitized and is more susceptible to damage or injury.

Dr. Russell will examine the entire length of the nerve to identify all possible issues that should be addressed. If the problem is musculoskeletal in nature, then treatment may include manipulation, mobilization, soft tissue work, nocturnal splinting, workstation modifications, stretches, and at-home exercises to reduce pressure on and increase the mobility of the median nerve. "Chiropractic adjustments is a natural, non-invasive alternative to surgery for the treatment of carpal tunnel syndrome," said Dr. Russell. "Spinal, as

well as hand and arm adjustments, will help to restore normal body function to improve the nervous system."

Changes in hormone levels can also lead to swelling of tissues around the median nerve, so Dr. Russell works with the patient's physician to co-manage the treatment to achieve relief for the patient.

The good news is that the non-surgical, chiropractic method in treating carpal tunnel syndrome is highly effective in patients with CTS, especially if the patient seeks care early in the course of the disease when their symptoms are milder. "We offer something to patients that they don't even know they want," said Dr. Russell, who has successfully treated hundreds of people who suffered from CTS.

To prevent CTS, the American Chiropractic Association recommends doing on-the-job exercises, stretching, taking frequent rest breaks and rotating jobs where possible. Wearing splints to keep wrists straight and using correct posture are also suggested.

Dr. Russell has 28 years of successful experience in gentle, preventative healthcare and is an expert in the diagnosis and treatment of many different problems.



# **Five Officers Honored**

Five Bartlesville Police Department officers received the BPD Life Saving Award



during a City Council meeting on Monday. In two of the cases, the life-saving drug Narcan was administered to individuals who had overdosed on heroin, while

another incident involved saving the life of a man who had attempted suicide.

Officer Steven Letterman responded to a call for service in November 2021 and encountered an unresponsive, apparently lifeless man on the floor of the residence. Letterman applied a series of "sternum rubs," a painful technique used to revive unresponsive individuals, which had no visible effect.

"Officer Letterman then administered a dose of Narcan nasal spray and continued the sternum rub until the man became responsive and alert," said Police Chief Tracy Roles. Roles said the man admitted later that he had used heroin prior to police arrival.

In a separate incident, Officer K.C. Jackson responded to a residence in January of this year, where a man was reportedly having a medical issue. Jackson approached the man, who was lying on the floor of the residence.

"The male was on his right side with a small amount of blood coming from his nose," Roles said. "He was not responding to Officer Jackson's voice and had very slow, delayed breaths. Officer Jackson was able to feel a faint pulse and could hear the occasional moan from the man. He attempted to wake the male with sternal rub while talking to him. When the man's color began to change and his lips began turning purple, Officer Jackson administered a dose of Narcan."

Roles said the man "took a deep breath and shook a little," and that Jackson resumed the sternal rub until Bartlesville Fire and EMS personnel arrived, "Once the male was loaded in the ambulance and was stable and awake, the man told authorities he had used heroin," Roles said.

Officers Patrick Ballard, Shawn Caudle, and Cpl. Ryan Deshields received the award for saving the life of a man who had attempted to hang himself at a local hotel.

"In the early morning hours of February 12, night shift officers were dispatched to an area hotel in reference to a possible suicidal subject," Roles said, noting that Caudle, Ballard, and Deshields quickly located the hotel room and attempted access with a room key card supplied to them by the hotel management.

Roles said the door was unable to be opened all the way due to a physical lock holding the door in the closed position, so officers kicked the door open, finding a man who had hung himself using a belt.

"The officers acted quickly and were able to cut the man down," Roles said, "They

administered first aid to the man until EMS arrived on scene."

Roles said the man had no pulse and was not breathing until receiving medical attention after the incident.

"It is clear that, had the officers not responded in an appropriate manner to the call and took the necessary action of forcing entry into the room, cutting the person down and administering aid to them, this person would have certainly died," he said.

"These are great examples of leadership and proper responses to situations that could have ended in the loss of life. The quick response and actions taken by these officers are a testimony to their dedication, not only to the Bartlesville Police Department but also the citizens of Bartlesville."

# City Okays Feasibility Study

The City Council on Monday voted to approve a contract to conduct a feasibility study regarding the need for a conference center in Bartlesville. Hunden Strategic Partners was selected for the job following the recommendation of a review committee established to oversee the matter. Talks regarding the need for a conference center have been ongoing for some time but ramped up considerably late last year when representatives for the First Christian Church, located at 520 S. Osage Ave., offered to donate the facility to the City to house the center.






# A Little Off-Center

# Get to Know Community Center's Phil Blender

you have ever attended an event at the Bartlesville Community Center, chances are you have seen Phil Blender — a longtime volunteer, a former employee of the center, and an avid supporter of the arts in Bartlesville.

Bartlesville Community Center Managing Director Val Callaghan said, "Even before I started working at the center, when I thought of the center, I thought of Phil Blender, because any time you came to the center, he was always here.

Phil was either behind the ticket counter selling tickets or he was giving tours to people."

Phil's creativity and passion for the arts stand out whenever he talks about performances or performers he has met. His knowledge of the arts is beyond "normal."

"Most people in the arts, especially professionals, are nice, but they are a little off-center, meaning they are not normal," said Phil, who fits that description to a T.

"Phil is a fountain of information about Broadway," said Callaghan. "He is a walking encyclopedia of knowledge when it comes to theater and Broadway. His enthusiasm for the arts is contagious. It's amazing."

This year marks the 40th anniversary of the Bartlesville Community Center's current building, but Phil was a fixture of the center even before the new building was constructed.

An anecdote Phil shared was about the demolition of the Civic Center: "One of the reasons the city wanted to tear down the old building was due to the aging balcony," he said with a smile. "They were concerned it might collapse, but when they were tearing down the building, they had to bring in a larger wrecking ball, as the first one they used would not demolish the balcony."

Phil came to Bartlesville in 1967 and worked for Phillips Petroleum Co. in the National Resources Group, where he worked for more than 16 years. That was followed by two years working at Ramada Inn as a front desk clerk/night auditor. During those years, he served as a volunteer at the Civic Center, which at that time shared the same premises with the Bartlesville Public Library.

Phil participated in "lots" of plays in the old center.

He laughingly recalled the old center had signs posted that read, "Do not flush toilets during performances," as they could be heard in the performance hall.

He also remembers when the seats in the former building were recovered with red leatherette. "All the gentlemen in white shirts who attended that year's Miss Bartlesville pageant left with red die on the bottom of their shirts."

Phil said one time the lighting boxes on the balcony were all painted dark on the inside and a performance had to be stopped for a bit because smoke started rolling out as the paint was curing.

In January 1989, the chair of the Trust Authority called and asked Phil to become the bookkeeper for BCC, because Bruce Price was being promoted from bookkeeper to interim managing director. Phil served as bookkeeper for several years, then he became the administrative assistant and served in that capacity until June 2020.

"Working at the Bartlesville Community Center has been great," Phil said. "It has allowed me to meet a lot of people."

He is full of stories rich in history of numerous local artists, leaders in the arts and people who have graced the BCC's stage.

He reminisced about meeting Ben Vereen: "In the 1980s I was working one Saturday at the kiosk in the lobby and a gentleman asked me to show him around. It was Ben Vereen. I really enjoyed spending time sitting around and talking about show business with him."

Another story Phil spoke about was meeting Robert Goulet: "We chatted about Camelot on Broadway. I asked him if he remembered the pillow fight during "The Happy Time," when a pillow was inadvertently thrown into the audience. He laughingly remembered it, and I told him I was the guy in the third row in the audience who was hit by that pillow ... I threw the pillow back on stage."

Phil said the best part about working at the Bartlesville Community Center was getting to work in the entertainment field. He has been excited to see exhibits and shows of the Bartlesville Art Association, Bartlesville Symphony Orchestra, Theater Bartlesville, Bartlesville Community Concerts Association and Bartlesville Civic Ballet. Phil has served on the board of directors for Bartlesville Civic Ballet for 10 years, Theater Guild for nearly 20 years and is now a life member, and Oklahoma Community Theater Association for more than 10 years.

When asked what his favorite production was to ever hit the BCC stage, Phil said he cannot name only one favorite, as he has seen several wonderful performances there. He does, however, have some favorite performers and local artists.

Phil is a huge fan of both sisters, Kennedy and Caitlyn Caughell.

"I remember both of them were under the age of 12 the first time I heard them singing and they were outstanding," said Phil. "When I asked them what they wanted to be when they grew up and they both said, 'On Broadway.'"

Kennedy, who went by the name Brittany in her younger years, and Caitlyn Caughell are daughters of Tracye Caughell, a longtime member of Children's Musical Theater Board of Directors.

He said his happiest moment was getting to see Kennedy Caughell playing the lead character Carol King in the musical Beautiful.

Next time you are at the Community Center, you can look for Phil donned in his red usher vest. Please be sure and thank him for more than 50 years serving Bartlesville's performing arts.

He deserves a big round of applause.
