Delivering Hope

The Cottage Offers Vital Pregnancy Services to Women

A local non-profit organization is helping mothers and babies by providing critical pregnancy and maternity services to those in need.

Two women's dream of helping mothers and babies and establishing a residential maternity home has become a reality ... The Cottage is turning five years old this year, and has now helped more than 600 women in Bartlesville.

Founders Juli Merciez, RN, BSN, MPC and Becky Thompson, RN, Ph.D., started working and developing their vision for The Cottage back in 2002. The Cottage has been in operation since February 2016. It has three areas of focus: A mobile unit

to provide free pregnancy tests and ultrasounds, a residential home, and training/clinic assisting women in securing resources for pregnancy, parenting or adoption, post-abortion support, education completion, and life skills development.

The Cottage helps women pursue their education, develop parenting and life skills, and engage in their community.

"In the past year, we have seen the number of women who need our help double," said Executive Director Lana Smith. "There is a tremendous need in our community for the services we offer, and we just want all the women out there who are struggling in these tough times that we are here to help them."

The non-profit 501(c)3 organization serves pregnant women at their point of need. The mobile unit and local clinic offers free pregnancy testing and ultrasounds to encourage women to embrace their baby growing inside.

"We believe healthy mom, healthy baby; happy mom, happy baby," said Smith. "We serve Washington, Osage and now Nowata counties, and have really made a focus on getting out and helping women in some of these smaller communities."

All of the residents in the residential maternity home work an individual plan focusing on healthy mom/baby, life skills, and education. They choose to work on their education, job, or volunteer 20 hours a week and set goals for their achievements each week. Over 62 percent of clients have not graduated from high school, so completing their GED is the first goal set. Graduation from the maternity home secures independent living,



a job, and ability to provide a safe and secure living environment for themselves and their children.

"Our clients are entering school, finishing their GED, completing technical training, and now a couple are in college," said Smith. "It is a story of lives changed. Amazing! We are guided by the love of Jesus and give hope to all those we serve."

They have collaborated with Ray of Hope Advocacy Center, Birthright of Bartlesville, Samaritan Counseling & Growth Center, Grand Lake Mental Health Center, Youth and Family Services of Washington County, and Delaware Child Development Center. In addition, Osage Nation WIC partners with The

Cottage, providing nutrition and events like farmers markets and breastfeeding resources. "We have served more than 600 women since we started as just a conversation," said Thompson. "We have housed and served 42 at the residential home"

"The women here have to work or go to school, and we certainly advocate for education over employment," said Smith. "It is just such a blessing to see the difference we are making in these women's lives."

The Cottage's financial sustainability comes from grants and private donations. "The Cottage relies heavily on the generosity of people from our community," said Smith. "Every contribution goes toward our clients, working their individual plans to feel like they are successful, loved, cared for, and part of our family. We accept new or like-new baby items, maternity clothes, or essential items to set up an initial household. We are always in need of volunteer time, diapers and wipes, cleaning supplies, and female personal hygiene items. We will put every item to good use."

On Saturday, October 8 at 6:30 p.m., The Cottage will host its annual Black & White Party at the Johnstone-Sayre event center. Dinner, client testimonies, casino royale entertainment, and an amazing time are in store, and all for a great cause. "Our Black & White Party is our biggest fundraiser of the year," said Smith. "We invite everyone to come out and have a great time while helping us help so many women." 

...About Treating Thumb Pain

The thumb joint, where it connects to the wrist, is one of the most common joints to become arthritic. This joint is known as the first carpometacarpal joint, or CMC joint.

Dr. Tracy Russell, D.C., The Hand and Foot Chiropractor in Bartlesville, is trained to

provide specific chiropractic adjustments to the small wrist and hand bones to restore healthy alignment and function to the irritated, degenerative joints. "In addition to pain relief, patients often experience increased strength, range of motion, and greater ability to grip objects for longer periods of time without pain and fatigue," said Dr. Russell. "Arthritic thumb pain and dysfunction can be helped through chiropractic care. If you know someone who is dealing with thumb pain, we recommend a chiropractic evaluation to determine if there is a solution that can provide relief and restore healthy function to their hand."

Because the thumb has such a broad range of motion, it receives the heaviest workload of all the hand joints. We use our thumbs to grip and hold most objects, and the thumb is always opposing the four fingers. Therefore, when you grasp an object, the thumb is required to exert the same force alone as all four of your other fingers do together. With sustained gripping of an

object, the thumb tends to become fatigued before the fingers. This fatiguing effect may cause the thumb to work less efficiently.

Over time, the joint will lose its healthy alignment where the thumb connects to the wrist. This misalignment will irritate the CMC joint and cause the cartilage surfaces to become worn. This wearing of the cartilage is referred to as degenerative joint disease or osteoarthritis. When two bones become misaligned relative to each other, the joint at which they connect becomes irritated and inflamed due to abnormal motion at the joint. The cartilage surfaces begin to wear unevenly and become thinner and abnormal over time. This process is one of the underlying causes of the degenerative process.
